Writing Workshop I: This workshop will present information on what colleges are looking for in a personal essay and also facilitate brainstorming where students will discover essay topics relevant to them. The goal is that students will leave with some great ideas to start their essay! Students should only attend one of these sessions as all Writing Workshop I are the same lesson.

Writing Workshop II: This session is a follow up session to writing workshop I. Students should have ideas about what they want to write their essay about and/or rough drafts. The objective is for students to understand how to put words to their ideas.

Financial Aid session: This session will provide an overview of all factors related to financial aid including how it is determined by the government, what steps must be followed by students and parents, what a loan versus a grant or scholarship is, and more.

The Application Process is for rising seniors and will provide information on how to complete an application, what colleges are looking for in an application, and how to request letters of recommendations and transcripts from your school.
