Factors in the admissions process

- Grades/GPA
- Curriculum
- Recommendations
- Class Rank



- SAT & ACT Scores
- Essay/Personal Statement
- Extracurricular
- Interviews
 - (if applicable)
- Portfolio

Parts of an Application

- Demographic & Extracurricular info submitted by student
- Transcript sent by OMHS
- Letters of Recommendation
 - Counselor & Teacher(s)
- Essay
- Interview (optional for some colleges)
- SAT & ACT Scores
 - MUST be sent electronically by student.

The College Essay

- Voice
- Many (but not all) schools will require
- If application has an "optional" essay...do it!



High School Transcript

- Unofficial transcripts were given to students this week in senior folders
- Weighted & Unweighted GPA
- Final grades from all courses 9 11
- Senior year schedule
- Rank available early October
- 1st Quarter Report card can be requested and sent if available

Transcript Request Form

- Submit to Ms. Bright in the counseling center during lunch shifts
- Parent Signature Required
- First 3 transcripts free, \$2 per transcript after that (cash or check made out to OMHS)
- Allow 20 school days for requests
 A deadline cheat sheet was provided to students.

Recommendations

Students should:

- 1. Personally ask teachers
- 2. Complete teacher & counselor info forms in Naviance
- Submit teacher request form (hard copy) to teacher
 (20 school days prior to deadline)
- Request teacher in Naviance after submitting transcript request form
- 5. Write a thank you note!

Scholarships

- □ Inside Scholarships are from the school.
 - Check school site to see if additional application materials required.
- Outside scholarships are from companies, foundations, community organizations. Require separate application.
 - Check Naviance Family Connection, under Colleges tab
- Watch for scams
 - Generally anything that requires you to pay money to be considered for a scholarship is a hoax

Financial Aid

- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
 - Apply now for FSA ID
 - Parents and student will need a FSA ID to electronically sign the FAFSA
 - Available for completion October 1, 2019
 - www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Should be completed by every college bound student regardless of economic need, to help ensure eligibility for any kind of scholarship.
- Also resources in Counseling Center

 - HCC representatives will be at OMHS all day to help families complete the FASFA. Sign up through link in the newsletter .
 - Additional FAFSA information will be shared as one of the break out sessions for the evening.

Upcoming Dates

- <u>Starting September 25:</u> Counselors meet individually with every senior to discuss posthigh school planning
- October 1: First FAFSA submission date
- October 2: Deadline to request teacher and counselor recommendations for November 1 college deadline
- □ **October 16:** PSAT Day (Visit Colleges/work on applications)
- November 1: Deadline for UMCP, UMBC, JMU, and many early action decisions
